The Sturgeon Bay Community

Sturgeon Bay is a charming city located in Door County, Wisconsin, nestled between the waters of Green Bay and Lake Michigan. As the county seat, it serves as a hub for the region's tourism, shipbuilding, and maritime industries. Sturgeon Bay School District is a comprehensive district with a wide range of academic and co-curricular activities. It is a unified school district serving the majority of residents in the City of Sturgeon Bay as well as a portion of the Town of Sevastopol. The district is made up of four schools housed in three buildings within the city of Sturgeon Bay. Other educational opportunities can be found in two exemplary parochial schools, St. Peter's and St. John Bosco; and two additional public school districts - Sevastopol and Southern Door County - also within the City corporate limits.



Municipal Organization

Sturgeon Bay operates under a mayor-council form of government, providing residents with both elected leadership and professional administration. The city's governing body is the Common Council, composed of the Mayor and seven Alderpersons.

The city employs a City Administrator, who acts as the chief administrative officer. This role includes overseeing daily operations, coordinating city departments, managing the annual budget, and implementing policies set by the Council. Municipal services are organized into five main departments: Administration, Police, Fire, Public Works, and Community Development. These departments manage essential services such as public safety, infrastructure maintenance, zoning, and community planning.

Serving on the City's department head team, the Community Development Director coordinates, directs, or performs activities relating to community and economic development, planning, annexation, assessment, building inspection, and code enforcement. The department is responsible for coordinating the overall growth and physical development of the city as well as preparing and coordinating the long-range plans for the City's future growth. The Director supervises the work of the Planner/Zoning Administrator and Community Development Administrative Assistant.

- Collaborating with the Common Council, Plan Commission, and staff to identify and implement policies aimed at economic and workforce opportunity, stability, and growth.

The Community Development Department is responsible for coordinating the overall growth and physical development of the city. Staff prepares and coordinates long-range plans for the City's future growth, coordinates activities relating to planning, economic development, and growth management. The Department provides guidance and assistance in order to achieve and maintain harmonious development of the city that meets the needs of existing and future residents, and which best promotes the City's welfare, character, convenience, prosperity, and efficiency.




Qualifications and Ideal Candidate Profile
